The goals of the Vietnamese Traditional Music Conference include:

 providing a forum for exchanging teaching experiences, performance opportunities, and study in vietnamese traditional music.

 creating bonds between Vietnamese traditional music performing arts groups worldwide.

promotion and preservation of Vietnamese traditional music.

The conference is offered every two years. The first was co-hosted in 2011 in Toronto, Canada by Tre Viet and Nhạc Việt Nam Ensemble. The second conference is hosted this year by Huong Viet Performing Arts Group in Washington State, USA

The Melody Institute Inc. was founded by Melody Xie, in Shoreline, Washington State, U.S.A, a professional dancer and choreographer with over 30 years of experience, with the goal to foster an appreciation of Chinese culture and language while making the talent of its members



available to the community, improving the students' self-confidence and leadership skills, and the promotion of international understanding and friendship. Melody Institute Incorporated has been performing in the Washington State for over 10 years. Each year, the group performs about 30 events. Noted performance include: Northwest Folklife Festival, Evergreen State Fair, KOMO KidsFair, Seattle Center's Chinese Culture and Arts Festival, Winterfest, and the World Festival.



Tre Việt Group is a Vietnamese Musical Group based in Mississauga - Canada . Founded in 2000, we are specializing in folk songs and music of the old imperial courts using Vietnamese traditional

musical instruments. The group is headed by Kim Uyên, a professional Vietnamese traditional musician who has performed throughout the world. Our group consists of many members, all dressed in traditional costume, and each plays a different instrument, will provide a peek into the past, the nostalgic Vietnamese society of the 19th century.

<u>Tiếng Vọng Quê Hương</u> is formed since 1985 in San Jose, California, U.S.A. Members of the group are Vietnamese traditional musicians and Vietnamese traditional singers who love the Vietnamese Traditional Music and would like to keep and maintain the Vietnamese Traditional Music in America, and to introduce the Art and the Beauty of Vietnamese Traditional Music to the World. The group currently has about twenty people and is directed by Mrs. Ngọc Lan and Mrs. Ngọc Dung. The Tiếng Vọng Quê Hương Ensemble performs variety type of Vietnamese Traditional Music from Vietnamese Folk Music (dân ca) to Vietnamese Classical Theatrical Music (Cải Lương

Sân Khấu). They have performed widely in Bay Area and have received love and compliment from Vietnamese



Community and Public.

Professor Phuong Oanh, PhD was born in Đà Lat in central Vietnam in 1945. She graduated from the Vietnamese Conservatory of Music in Saigon in 1962 and taught music at Saigon National Conservatory of Music from 1964-1975. In 1969 she founded the Phuong Ca Dân Ca Quốc Nhạc music school. In 1996, Prof. Phuong Oanh completed her music degree and received credentials of National Professor of Dan tranh (equivalent to a PhD degree in the USA). During over forty years of teaching Vietnamese traditional music, Prof. Phuong Oanh has trained many eminent Vietnamese traditional artists,

including artists Kim Uyên, Kim Hiền, Ngọc Dung, Nguyệt Ánh, and Vân Anh. With her ensemble, Prof. Phương Oanh has performed throughout the world. In recognition of her many contributions to traditional music, she was awarded in 1988 the gold medal for music from the Asian Cultural Academy.




Professor Ngọc Dung began to study the Vietnamese zither at the age of seven. She graduated from and taught at the Art and National Conservatory of Music and Drama College, Saigon, Vietnam from 1967-1979 specializing in the 16 to 22 thin metal strings instrument "đàn Tranh" (Vietnamese zither). The Echo of the Motherland, also known as "Tiếng Vọng Quê Hương", is a professional non-profit musical organization located in the City of San Jose in the heart of Northern

California's Silicon Valley. It was founded in 1980 by Professor Ngoc Dung. In 1999, the group obtained nonprofit status, and in 2000, Echo of the Motherland raised thousands of much needed fund for an orphanage in Vietnam. Many talented and now well-known actors, singers, musicians in the Vietnamese community have graced the stage at the Echo of the Motherland's performance events, and the group continues to attract professional actors, singers, and musicians as young as 7 years of age from across the country each year. 2013 marks the group's 33th year of production in the United States.




Professor Pham Thúy Hoan was born on Jun. 26, 1942 in Nam Định, Vietnam. After studying đàn Tranh at the Saigon National School of Drama and Music, she was awarded the Gold Medal from the school in 1960 and graduated as the best of her class in 1962. In 1966 she became the leader of the Hoa Sim National Music and Folk Song Group, which also included Prof. Phương Oanh in France, Quỳnh Hạnh, Huyền Trân and Ngọc Dung. She was professor at the Saigon National School of Drama and Music until she retired in 1997, and was also a

guest professor at the Huế National School of Music. After retirement, she remains committed to the the teaching and performance of đàn tranh, and works as director of Tiếng Hát Quê Hương which she founded in 1981. Thanks to her excellence as a teacher, her students have become talented artists in traditional music. She has written many famous study books for self study of the instrument. In 1993 she was awarded the Diploma of Merit from the Ministry of Culture and Information for excellence in the training of young talent who won top prizes in international and national music



Hướng Việt Performing Arts Group / Đoàn Văn Nghệ Dân Tộc Hướng Việt is a registered 501c3 nonprofit organization in Washington State, U.S.A., with the goal to promote and popularize Vietnamese traditional music and arts. Since its establishment in 2001, Hướng Việt Performing Arts Group has performed throughout the United States and Canada. Hướng Việt Performing Arts Group actively participates in many community events such as Folklife Festival, Arts Gumbo, and Winter World Festival, and regularly provides educational opportunities through lectures, exhibits, and workshops on Vietnamese culture at universities, community colleges, elementary schools, and libraries.

Phượng Ca Dân Ca Quốc Nhạc was founded in 1969, in Vietnam, and later Paris, France, with the goal to promote, preserve, and popularize Vietnamese traditional music. During forty-five years since it was

founded by professor Phương Oanh, Phượng Ca has become well-known all over the world. Phượng Ca was not founded to train professional musicians but to introduce to all young Vietnamese the ability to play Vietnamese traditional instruments and help them to develop an appreciation of Vietnamese traditional music.

Phượng Ca Oslo is a branch of Phượng Ca in Paris, France. The group was founded to help preserve and teach Vietnamese traditional music. The group was founded based on a program organized by Vietnor in 2000. After the group was no longer active in 2001, the dan tranh class remained and transformed into a specialized group for Vietnamese traditional music. In 2003, Phượng Ca Oslo became a registered



organization in Norway.



Hương Xưa was founded in 2007 with the goal to promote and preserve Vietnamese traditional music in our new homeland, America. Currently, Huong Xua has twelve members. Hải Yến and Ngọc Hương serve as director and professor Phạm Thúy Hoan serves as advisor. All members

are able to play Đàn Trành and one or two other Vietnamese traditional instruments such as đàn bầu, flute, percussion, tam thập lục, and tỳ bà. Even though Hương Xưa is not a professional group, they have received many good comments from the audience for their eye-catching costumes and artistic music.

Tiếng Hát Quê Hương founded in 1981 by professor Phạm Thúy Hoan, in Vietnam, with the goal to promote, preserve and popularize Vietnamese traditional music and dance. Since establishment, the group has trained many well



known professional musician for Vietnamese traditional music such as dan Tranh gold medalist Håi Phượng, Tam thập lục and K'longput gold medalist Hải Yến. To promote folkmusic, the group regularly organizes stage performances as well as produces Vietnamese music program for national TV, as well as forming classes that teach Vietnamese traditional instruments such as đàn tranh, đàn bầu, bamboo flute, đàn nhị, and folksong singing.

<u>Tiếng Hoài Hương</u> is a nonprofit organization founded by Professor Phạm Hương in Portland, Oregon, U.S.A. Since establishment, Tiếng Hoài Hương has been actively promoting Vietnamese



traditional music to the Vietnamese community in Oregon. Asides from performing Vietnamese traditional music, Tiếng Hoài Hương also teach and guide younger generation to learn Vietnamese traditional music by open classes that teach đàn tranh, đàn bầu, and other Vietnamese traditional musical instruments.

competitions. In 1994 she received the title of "Eminent Teacher" from the Ministry of Education and the medal "Excellent Contribution to Education" in 1995. Now her students are spread all over the world and help bring Vietnamese traditional music to Vietnamese communities everywhere.

Professor Nguyễn Văn Đời was born in 1937 in Long An, Vietnam. He graduated from the Vietnamese Conservatory of Music in 1961, majoring in dan tranh and dan nguyet. He served as dean for the school from 1967-1975. In 1970, he was invited to direct the Vietnamese traditional orchestra at the Expo-Osaka. Throughout his teaching career, many of his students have graduated and won prestigious awards. Particularly noted are two dan tranh Gold medalist winners, Kim Hiền (now resides in Australia) and Kim Uyên (resides in Toronto, Canada). Aside from teaching, he has dedicated his life to research and writing books about Vietnamese traditional music. Many of his compositions are celebrated by other traditional musicians and audiences.

Kim Uyên (Lê Thị Kim) is a composer and virtuoso of Vietnamese traditional music on đàn tranh. In 1984, she received the National Gold Medal for Excellent Đàn Tranh Performance. Throughout years studying đàn tranh at the Vietnamese Conservatory of Music, Ms. Kim Uyên continuously ranked first in her class and graduated as a valedictorian. Upon her completion for master degree in music at Monash University, Australia, with a Women's Scholarship,



Ms. Kim Uyên actively performed and participated in many traditional musical programs across Asia, Australia, United States, Canada, and Europe. She has produced six albums about đàn tranh and Vietnamese traditional music, and appeared in numerous radio and television programs. Ms. Kim Uyên is also a member of many prestigious Vietnamese traditional music groups such as Tiếng Hát Quê Hương, Thiếu Nhi Lê Văn Khoa, Back to Back Zither, and Hồng Lạc. She is now residing in Ontario, Canada. Currently, Ms. Kim Uyên is an advisor for Hướng Việt Performing Arts Group.



<u>Võ Vân Ánh</u> devotes her life-long passion and mastery of the dan tranh zither to the creation of distinctive music blended with a cultural essence that can only come from this unique Vietnamese instrument. Among her accomplishments are the 2009 Emmy® Award-winning soundtrack for the documentary "Bolinao 52", which she co-composed and recorded, and the soundtrack for the Sundance best documentary and 2003 Academy Awards®

nominee "Daughter from Danang". Van-Anh also co-composed and recorded for the recent documentary "A Village Called Versailles", winner of the New Orleans Film Festival Audience Award. Vân-Ánh began studying dan tranh from the age of four, and graduated with distinction from and taught at the Vietnam Academy of Music. In 1995, Vân-Ánh won championship in the Vietnam National Đàn Tranh Competition along with the first prize for best solo performance of modern folk music. She has since performed in more than fourteen countries and recorded in many broadcast programs inside and outside of Vietnam.

Phạm Đức Thành is a world-renowned musician known for his masterful ability on the Vietnamese one-stringed instrument (đàn bầu). He was born in 1958 in Ninh Bình, Vietnam. His talent was fully apparent from his youth: he was adept at the Cheo drumming style at age 4, he learned the mandolin at age 5, and he had begun playing đàn Bầu (monochord) and Đàn Nhị (2-string fiddle) at the age of 5. In 1974, Đức Thành left Hà Nội to join the largest Chèo opera troupe in Vietnam

and officially became a professional đàn bầu performer. At the end of 1978 he was the only đàn bầu musician of the Chèo opera stage to attend the national đàn bầu competition of Vietnam in Hà Nội; soon after, he went to Sài Gòn to study further the music of central and southern Vietnam. In October of 1983, he graduated with top honors from the Center for Musical Research of Vietnam. It was here that he became recognized as one of the rising musicians on đàn bầu in traditional as well as modern music. In 1985, Phạm Đức Thành won Gold Medal for excellent performnace on the Đàn Bầu.

Hải Yến is the daughter of Professor Phạm Thúy Hoan, an executive director of Tiếng Hát Quê Hương Ensemble. Hải Yến entered Conservatory of Music in Saigon, Vietnam, in 1979 majoring in Đàn Tranh. After six years, Hải Yến changed her major to World's Percussions and graduated in 1989 with honor. Since then, Hải Yến has toured many countries such as South Korea, China, Hong Kong, Macau, Thailand, Singapore, Japan, France, Germany, Belgium. Hải Yến's most noted accomplishment include First Prize for Tam Thập Lục



(Vietnamese 36 strings dulcimer) Performance in 1981-1982 and Gold Medal for K'long Put at the Musical Festival in Okinawa Japan 1999.



<u>Thanh Hòa</u> is regarded as one of the most accomplished professional Vietnamese bamboo flute player in the present day. Some of her achievements include the Gold medal award for Vietnamee bamboo flute performance in 1989, and the Gold Lotus Award for best ensemble performance in 1997. Artist Thanh Hòa has been invited to perform in concerts around the world, as in Singapore, Malaysia, Japan, etc. Besides performing

and teaching, she has composed many important solo pieces for the bamboo flute, including Khói Lam Chiều (Gray Smoke in the Evening Hearth), and has written extensively on the Vietnamese bamboo flute.

<u>Thúy Vân</u> graduated from the Vietnam National Conservatory of Music in 1988. Since graduation, she participated in many professional traditional music groups and taught music at many music schools. In 1988, she received a Silver medal for best performance on traditional Vietnamese instruments.
